

**ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS**  
**WATER TREATMENT PLANT ELECTRICAL SYSTEM REPLACEMENT & UPGRADES**  
**TOWN OF MICANOPY, FLORIDA**

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Sealed Bids for the construction of the Water Treatment Plant Electrical System Replacement & Upgrades project will be received by the Town of Micanopy at the office of the Town Clerk, 706 NE Chokolka Boulevard, Micanopy, Florida 32667 (P.O. Box 137), until 3:00 p.m. local time on December 11, 2017, at which time the Bids received will be publicly opened and read aloud.

The Project consists of generally replacing the electrical system at the Town's Water Treatment Plant located at 501 NW Seminary Avenue, including the replacement of two 40-hp well pumps, new controls and generator.

Bids will be received for a single prime Contract. Bids shall be on a lump sum, basis, as indicated in the Bid Form.

The Issuing Office for the Bidding Documents is: Mittauer & Associates, Inc., 580-1 Wells Road, Orange Park, Florida 32073, (904) 278-0030. Prospective Bidders may examine the Bidding Documents at the Issuing Office, Monday through Friday, and may obtain copies of the Bidding Documents from the Issuing Office as described below.

Bidding Documents also may be examined at the Micanopy Town Hall, 706 NE Chokolka Boulevard, Micanopy, Florida, 32667 (352) 466-3121, Monday through Thursday.

Bidding Documents will be provided on compact disc as portable document format (PDF) files and as printed Bidding Documents (one of each), for a non-refundable charge of \$120 per set, payable to "Mittauer & Associates, Inc." Upon Issuing Office's receipt of payment, the digital and printed Bidding Documents will be sent via UPS Ground. Partial sets of Bidding Documents will not be available from the Issuing Office. Neither Owner nor Engineer will be responsible for full or partial sets of Bidding Documents, including Addenda, if any, obtained from sources other than the Issuing Office.

Bid security shall be furnished in accordance with the Instructions to Bidders.

To be considered qualified, Bidder shall be licensed to engage in the business of contracting in the State of Florida by the Construction Industry Licensing Board and shall have successfully completed, as prime contractor, a minimum of 3 projects of a similar nature for a public water supply treatment plant within the past 5 years each having a minimum contract value of \$100,000.
